Resolution to Amend section 12 of the Constitution

Background: As a result of a long-term reduction in membership, it has proved increasingly difficult to achieve the figure of 25 people present that is sufficient for the AGM to be quorate under section 12 of the Constitution (see below). This figure now represents about one sixth of the membership. In 2022 insufficient members booked, and phone calls had to be made to request members to attend to prevent the AGM being inquorate.

Changes to the Constitution: According to section 14 of the Constitution, a provision of the Constitution may be amended by a majority of two-thirds of those present and voting at a General Meeting.

Proposal by the Executive Committee: To amend section 12 of the Constitution to read as follows (altered wording is highlighted).

12. ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING: The Annual General Meeting shall be held not later than six months after the close of the financial year. The ordinary business to be transacted shall be: - (a) to receive the report of the Executive Committee, (b) to receive the Financial Statement, (c) to appoint a President (should there be a vacancy), or Vice-Presidents and Honorary Officers and the Executive Committee for the ensuing year, and (d) to appoint an Honorary Examiner. A quorum of fifteen members in total will be necessary to conclude any business. Formal notice of any other business to be transacted shall be sent to the Secretary not less than fourteen days before the Meeting, or in the case of a proposed amendment to the Constitution, not less than twenty-eight days. Formal notice of the Annual General Meeting is to be sent out to members not less than 21 days before the date of the AGM.
